Five Pianists To Perform At Lucas

LUCAS — Lucas School Music Department, now in enlarged and revamped quarters in the high school building, will present five well-known adult pianists in a concert at 2 p. m. Sunday to dedicate a new grand piano.

Louis Morace, music director, has arranged the program which will feature a potpourri of piano music by Nellie Allen Adams, a pianist and teacher from Logan and three Mansfielders: Mrs. Werner Beugger, currently pianist with the Riley Norris Quartet, Mrs. James Germany, a Purdue University graduate active in Mansfield musical circles since 1953, and Jim Minium, a Penn State University graduate now playing with the Vic Day Dance Group. Morace, known for playing dinner music as well as a teacher, will be the fifth performer.

Supporting artists will include Allen Adams, Carpenter School music teacher and member of Mansfield Symphony and local dance groups and James Ackerman, who has studied with Charlie Wilcox in Cleveland and traveled extensively with music groups. Adams will play string bass and Ackerman, percussion instruments.

Mrs. Adams will open the afternoon program with Chopin and Debussy selections.

Mrs. Beugger will play popular numbers. Her selections will include "When Sunny Gets Blue," "Beautiful Love," "My Ship," "If You Could See Me Now," and "Israel."

Mrs. Germany's selections

will include those by Bach and Bartok, as well as several current ballads.

Minium's numbers will include "Jersey Bounce," "He Never Entered My Mind," "Sonny Boy," "Can't Help Lovin' That Man," and "Let's Get Away from It All."

Morace will close the concert with a Debussy selection and others by Brubeck and Gershwin.

Because of the department's limited seating capacity, Morace asked that the audience be restricted to adults only. The public is invited.

Students To See Space Devices

The National Aeronautics and Space Administration Spacemobile will be in Morrow County tomorrow. Two lecture - demonstrations will be given, one at Iberia School at 10 a. m. and the other at Highland High School at 2 p. m.

The Spacemobile is a traveling space science demonstration unit consisting of models of launch vehicles, satellites and space probes, electronic equipment and other special devices.
